Thank you for entering the 2026 Scottish Schools' Secondary Combined Events, Hammer, Steeplechase and Primary Relay Championships incorporating Para athlete development.

Athletes must present themselves individually at Declarations, which will be situated in the warmup area in the indoor track.

Please note: Declarations open from **8:30am** and close at **12:00pm** for **Primary Relays** and **12:30pm** for all **Steeplechase athletes**.

Competitor numbers should be pinned to the front and back of a school vest, SSAA International vest, or plain vest. Club vests must not be worn. Acceptable vests are shown below.



Please bring your own safety pins. Personal implements must be handed in at Declarations.

Start lists and results will be accessible via the QR codes displayed around the venue.

The Assembly Area will be situated beside the warmup area in the indoor track. All athletes must report there according to the timetable, which will be displayed around the venue. Please also listen carefully for announcements.

Please note:

Combined Event Athletes:

- After the first event, all subsequent times in the timetable are approximate and may change throughout the day depending on the progress of the previous event, in line with Combined Events rules. Please listen carefully for announcements.
- Due to the large number of entries, and to ensure fairness for all Combined Events athletes, competitors will receive 1 warm-up and 3 trials.
- **High Jump** - Starting heights are as follows: U16G - 1.30m; U18/20W - 1.40m

Hammer Athletes:

- Athletes will receive 1 warm-up and 3 trials, with the best 8 athletes in each age group receiving a further 3 trials.

Schools are reminded that named staff and parents may be asked to officiate on the day. Any requests will be communicated via announcements, so please listen carefully.

Primary Relays

Please complete the team declaration sheet when collecting your numbers.

There will be 2 runs and a final:

Run 1 – all teams will compete.

Run 2 – all teams will compete. Lanes will be allocated based on Run 1 times.

Final – qualification will be based on the results from Run 2 only.

UKA Anti-Doping may be present at the championships. The UKA Anti-Doping Rules apply to all entrants participating in athletics for 12 months from the date of the competition, whether or not the entrant is a citizen of, or resident in, the UK.
